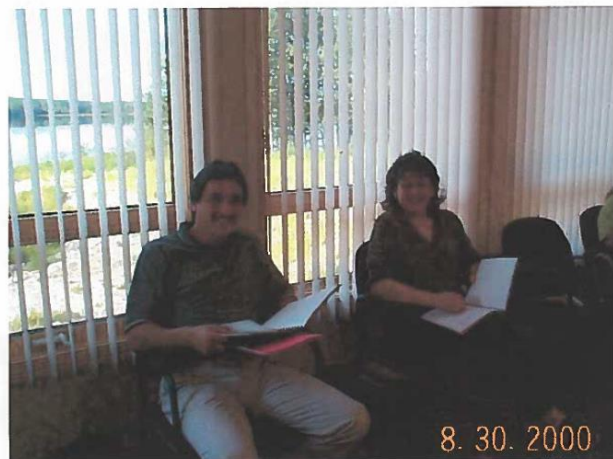

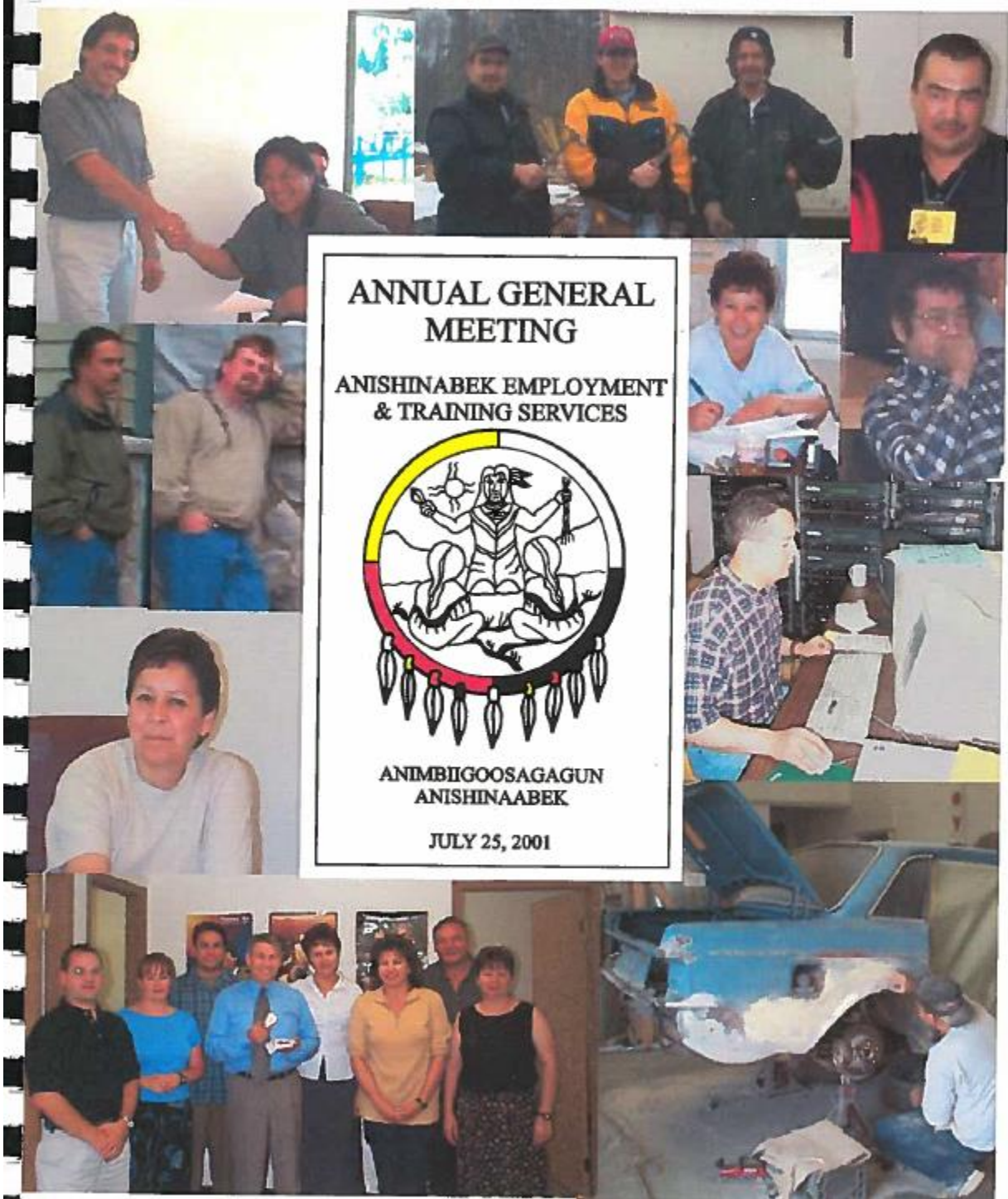

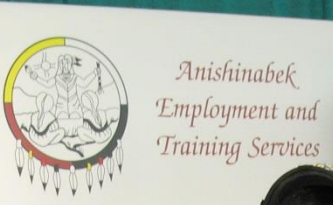

- Able to provide their own accommodation during the intervention
